Dear Ms. Glazer,

As an organization dedicated to promoting free speech, including freedom of artistic expression, we were deeply concerned to learn that the Jewish Community Center of San Francisco (JCCSF) removed two works from *La Frontera: Artists Respond to the U.S.-Mexico Border Crisis*, the current exhibition at the Katz Snyder Gallery. We strongly urge you to restore these works to the exhibition.

The JCCSF's Chief Program Officer David Green asserts that these works depict violence against children and dead children, and hence are not appropriate for display in the center's gallery, which is accessible to children. However, given the exhibition's theme of immigration, detainment and asylum, and similar dark content of other works in the show, this seems an unlikely justification for their removal. Indeed, it is absurd to require an exhibition that explores issues of global turmoil, migration, borders and human rights to reduce its content to material that would not disturb a child.

Since JCCSF administrators reportedly rejected another work initially chosen to be in the show because it references the Gaza Strip, the removal of the works suggests that they were, in fact, excluded because they reference conflicts and displacement in Syria and the Middle East. Such viewpoint-based censorship is a blemish on an institution that prides itself on providing a platform for the discussion of complex issues.

We strongly urge the JCCSF to reverse its decision to censor these artworks, to instead support the choices made by its curator while upholding its responsibility to artists in the show and the center's mission: to bring people together to explore, connect and flourish in a changing world. We hope to receive your response by Tuesday, July 2.
