Dear Members of the School Board,

The National Coalition Against Censorship is an alliance of national nonprofit groups dedicated to protecting freedom of expression, including the rights of K-12 students, teachers and staff. We are writing in regard to the District's recent removal of the children's book, *A Day in the Life of Marlon Bundo* by Jill Twiss.

As we understand it, the decision to remove the book was based on the August 12th finding of the Broward County Public Schools District Review Committee that stated, "The title is a picture book that is inappropriate due to the negativity towards the government."

That action was improper because, as you know, the Supreme Court has warned that "school boards may not remove books from library shelves simply because they dislike the ideas contained in those books" *Board of Education v. Pico*, 457 U.S. 853, 872 (1982) (plurality opinion). Just last year, the Court reaffirmed the principle underlying *Pico*, stating that public schools have a responsibility to protect unpopular ideas. *Mahanoy Area Sch. Dist. v. B. L.*, 594 U.S. \_\_\_, 141 S. Ct. 2038, 2046 (2021). Therefore, the removal of the book raises serious First Amendment concerns.

We urge the district to return the book and to ensure that book review committees do not use improper criteria when evaluating books.

Thank you for your attention to this important issue.
